Candidates will be assessed from the topics below and questions will be presented in a simple format. Candidates are expected to prepare for the answers.

Prepare for the questions below:

1. Learn about the first five followers.

- Learn about the first five followers**
- Who they are and what was the first Dhamma sermon.**

Yasa, and friends

- How many were there?**
- Who are Yasa's close friends?**

- Names of the Kasspa Brothers**
- How many followers did each of them have?**

- Explain what happened and which story did the Buddha tell.

Taking Prince Nanda as a follower.

- How did he get Prince Nanda to follow him? And what about the story of the she-monkey and the Nymphs?

Taking Prince Rahula as a follower.

- Who sent Prince Rahula, and what did he ask from the Buddha?
- What did Suddhodhana ask from the Buddha that later became a rule?

3. The two chief disciples of the Buddha and their stories.

4. Gatha Study Guide

Recite two stanzas/Gathas from the following list. Two or three random Gathas will be tested.

- i. Offering of lights
- ii. Offering of incense
- iii. Offering of flowers (Must include both stanzas)
- iv. Offering all together

Recite stanzas/Gathas for honoring/revering parents.

- I. Worshipping mother.
- II. Worshipping father.

Students will need to recite 2 or 3 Gathas that the teacher will randomly select.
